## Your Perfect Cut...

84% say face shape influences cut & styling



### JESSICA BIEL SQUARE

Women with square faces look especially good with center parts, says Gretchen Monahan, who also recommends angled cuts. "Medium length to long layers will soften the corners at the top and bottom of the face," she says.



### LIV TYLER LONG

To flatter an oblong face, avoid volume at top of the head; it will make your face look narrower. Keep hair on the crown smooth and add bangs (blunt or side-swept) or shaggy layers that hit at nose level to create the illusion of a wider face.



### SCARLETT JOHANSSON HEART

Counterbalance a small, pointy chin by focusing volume and layers at chin level so the space around the chin is filled. Another option: "If a bob hits there, it will strengthen the jawline," says **Eva Scrivo**.



### DEBRA MESSING ROUND

Short styles and bangs only accentuate roundness. Instead, have layers cut so the ends hit at cheek level or below to help "cover some of the width and draw focus away from cheeks," Monahan says. Add height on top to elongate your face.



### HALLE BERRY OVAL

This face shape, where the center of the face is the widest point, is the most versatile. Decide which feature you want to emphasize and cut your hair accordingly: For instance, to play up your eyes, try thick, blunt bangs that hit right at your brows.
